

Year 1 and 2 - Curriculum Overview and Homework Activities



Our learning

This term we will be learning about the developments in transport over time.

During our English lessons, we will read and write adventure stories in which different forms of transport are used to navigate the world, escape from the villain and find the treasure. Towards the end of the term, when we have built up our knowledge about transport, we will write non-fiction texts about significant individuals in the history of transport, including the Wright brothers, George Stevenson and Henry Ford.

During Maths lessons, we will focus on mathematical processes, including addition, subtraction and multiplication and division. We will explore different forms of measurement including length, height, and mass.

In History lessons, we will research significant individuals in the development of transport and we will create timelines to show the progression of transport through time. We will consider how advances in technology have enabled transport to evolve and improve over time.

In Science we will learn about animals including humans and we will familiarise ourselves with basic functions of the human body and investigate how we can stay fit and healthy.

PE lessons will be based around dance skills and outdoor fitness.



Reading every night is the most important thing you can do to support your child with

their learning. Use the books sent home and the e-book library to support with this. There are weekly spellings to learn as well as TTROCKSTARS and time tables practice. We also set weekly Maths homework– a sheet will be stuck in the homework book ready to complete each week.

Make an alphabetical list of ten different types of transport.	How much do your family know about the history of transport? Make a tally chart to count how many people in your family can tell you an interesting fact about transport and write a list of facts.
Transport is a very interesting topic. Can you use books or the internet to find out about your favourite type of transport?	Draw and label the different parts of the body we have been learning about. In Science. Can you write a description of what these parts of the body do or what they are for?	Draw 12 cars on your page. Colour half of the cars blue and a quarter of the cars in red. How many are left?	On a journey you see, 4 yellow cars, 6 blue cars, 8 green cars, 2 red cars and 10 silver cars. How many cars do you see altogether?
