Topic	English	Maths
Compose and perform a rainforest dance/music (perhaps with a friend/s). What music/sounds would fit with the rainforest theme? What movements could you do? Be ready to perform it to the class!	Write an imaginative story about the life of a child surviving in the rainforest. How did they get there? Where will they end up? What will they see? How do they look after themselves? Who or what might they be afraid of?	<u>Each week, the children will be set homework on MyMaths. This needs to be completed by Friday.</u>
Design and create a mask in the style of a rainforest creature. This could be made out of paper or card, or even fabric.	Write and illustrate a rainforest poem. Can you include similes, metaphors <i>and</i> an example of personification?	
Create a 3D model that shows the 4 main layers of the rainforest. You could use a range of materials - even real plant-life!	Write and illustrate a non-chronological report about a rainforest creature of your choice. Include information about its habitat, diet, appearance etc. ★	
Create a rainforest painting or collage.	Create a poster that explains <i>why</i> and <i>how</i> we should save our rainforests. 🏆	
Create a board or card game with a rainforest theme. Remember to include instructions so that we can play it! ★	Create a word search or crossword puzzle that contains at least 12 rainforest keywords.	
Design an outfit that is suitable for a rainforest explorer. Think carefully about which gadgets and tools it might include to help the explorer in their work. Label your drawing/s to explain your ideas.	Write a series of diary entries in the role of a rainforest explorer. Write about your discoveries - include information about the sights and sounds of the rainforest as well as your thoughts and feelings.	
Create an illustrated map that shows the path of a rainforest nature walk. Include information about what can be seen and heard as well as where the best sights and photo opportunities might be.	Combine the features of two animals from the rainforest to create your own new animal. Make a fictional fact file for it. What name would you give it? Which features did you choose and why?
