Topic	English	Maths
Make a model of a boat. This might be a sailing dinghy, barge, canoe, tanker, or any other boat that you might find on a river.	Produce a fact-file for a famous river such as the Nile, Colorado River, Mississippi, Amazon, Ganges or Danube. Include information about how the river is used, as well as key information about its length and course.	<u>Each week, the children will be set Maths homework. This might be a 'MyMaths activity'. Maths homework needs to be completed by Friday.</u>
Design a table which gives information about five different rivers. Think carefully about what headings to choose.		
A river's depth relies on rainfall. Make a rain gauge and keep a record of how much water falls across the course of a week. Produce a graph to show your results.	Produce an advert for a river holiday destination. This could be presented as a power point or through other use of ICT, on paper or even through drama. 	
Create a sculpture of a river creature or plant. You could use clay, salt dough, papier mache or any other material of your choice.	Write a play script that features the scene in Charlie and the Chocolate Factory where Augustus Gloop falls into the chocolate river.	
Label the longest river in each continent on a map of the world. 	Research a creature that lives either in, or beside a river (anywhere in the world) and create a fact-file about it.	
Re-create a piece of river-themed art by one of these famous artists: Claude Monet; J.M.W Turner; Pierre-Auguste Renoir; Georges Seurat; Vincent Van Gough.	Write a poem about a river creature. Use similes, metaphors and personification to bring this creature to life!	
	Make a poster that details the causes and effects of river pollution.	
Research and make a model of a famous bridge.	Write an introduction to a debate on the subject of plastic pollution.
