<p>Family tree Everyone's family are different. Create a family tree of your family members. Can you draw pictures of your family members or include pictures if you have any?</p>	<p><u>Spelling</u> Children will receive spellings each week. These should be practised using the Look, Cover, Write and Check strategy. The children should then write sentences to apply these spellings.</p>	<p>Shape Family Create pictures of your family members out of the shapes that you know. Challenge yourself by labelling these 2D shapes.</p>
<p>A family house There are lots of different types of houses that people can live in. They can be big, they can be small, they can be short and they can be tall. Create a sketch of the home that you live in. Can you include pictures of your family that live there with you?</p>	<p><u>Reading</u> Children should be reading for ten minutes each night. Please initial in their planner so that we can reward them with a star. Children are encouraged to change their own books but if this isn't happening we are happy to remind them.</p>	<p>Money, Money, Money  Money helps us to buy lots of important things. Draw pictures of all the coins that you know and label how much they were worth. Did any of your family members ever use different coins? Can you find out about them?</p>
<p>Research time  We see famous people on the television, in magazines and newspapers every day. Research a famous person that you know and find out about their family. Can you find out their names, ages and their jobs if they have one?</p>	<p>Diary Entry  Our families are very interesting. Their lives may be very different to ours. Write a diary entry pretending to be a family member and think about what they do during the day when we are working hard at school.</p>	<p>Worded Problems My mum went to the shop and bought 6 bananas. At home she already had 4 apples and 3 pears. How many pieces of fruit does she have in her fruit bowl altogether? Create your own worded problems and as see if your family can answer them.</p>
<p>Create a poster  Everyone has different aspirations of what they want to be when they are older. Create a poster about what you would like to be when you grow up.</p>	<p>Autobiography This term we are learning about autobiographies. Write an autobiography about yourself. Include your name, how old you are, what you like and what you don't like.</p>	<p>Make a tally chart  Make a tally chart of the number of girls and boys that are in your family. Can you make a list of their names and what their favourite colours are?</p>
<p>Self-portrait A self-portrait is a picture of yourself. Use a mirror do draw a picture of yourself and label the different features on your face.
