




<p><u>A Healthy Meal</u> Eating healthily is very important. Can you design a healthy and delicious plate of food? It could be for lunch, dinner or even breakfast. You can draw and label your design.</p> <p></p>	<p><u>Spelling</u> Children should be practising spelling the days of the week, months of the year and common exception words for the year group that they are in. These can be found on the school website within Key Stage 1 Home Learning.</p>	<p><u>Estimating</u> Can you weigh some items of fruit and vegetables? You can estimate how heavy you think they are and then weigh them to find out if you are correct?</p> 
<p><u>Research</u> Create a fact file/ collage or a poster about a farm animal.</p> <p></p>  <p>Pig Sheep</p>	<p><u>Reading</u> Children should be reading for ten minutes each day. Use their Reading Buddy account to find a selection of books to read or choose books from your own reading collections to read to a family member.</p> 	<p><u>Shape Tractor</u> Tractors are important on the farm because they help the farmer. Can you design a tractor using 2D shapes? How many circles, squares or hexagons have you used? If you are looking for a challenge – what other 2D shapes could you use in your design?</p> 
<p><u>Grow Your Own Food</u> Can you choose a plant to grow? You might like to grow a bean, some cress or a tomato plant. You could keep a diary to show how much it grows and then eat what you have grown.</p>	<p><u>Recite a poem.</u> What is your favourite poem or rhyme? Can you think of a rhyme of a poem about a farm animal? You need to practise it and then you can perform it to your family!</p> <p></p>	<p><u>Strawberry Problem</u> A farmer has twenty strawberries. He wants to put them into two baskets. How many different ways can he share them out? Each basket does not have to have the same number of strawberries in it.</p>
<p><u>Cooking</u> Can you find a recipe for a healthy and delicious meal and then make it? You will need an adult to help you. You could draw a picture to show what you cooked or take photographs to share with the class.</p> 	<p><u>Fact Finding</u> There are different types of farms in the United Kingdom and around the world. Can you find out about some different farms? What animals or crops do they have? How are they different? You can draw and write about what you find.</p>	<p><u>Favourite Farm Animals</u> Can you make a tally chart to show how many people in your family like the different animals on the farm? You might include pigs, chickens, cows, goats and even horses.</p> 
<p><u>Fruit and Vegetable Taste Test</u> Choose some different fruit and vegetables to taste.
